Bill Summary

The Railways (Second Amendment) Bill, 2008

- The Railways (Second Amendment) Bill, 2008 was introduced in the Lok Sabha on October 20, 2008. The Bill was referred to the Standing Committee on Railways (Chairperson: Shri Basudeb Acharia), which is scheduled to submit its report within three months.
- The Railways Act, 1989 provides that the Chairman and other members of the Railway Rates Tribunal shall hold
- office on prescribed terms. The salaries and pensions are notified through rules. The Act does not permit any amendments to the rules with retrospective effect.
- This Bill enables rules to be notified with retrospective effect, so that salaries and pensions may be revised retrospectively.
