
## Profile of the 15th Maharashtra Legislative Assembly

Results of the election to the 15<sup>th</sup> Maharashtra Legislative Assembly were declared on November 23, 2024. The Maharashtra Assembly has 288 seats. This note looks at the profile of the incoming Legislative Assembly.


#### Number of women MLAs reduces; 59% MLAs have college degrees




Note: The Assembly's size increased from 264 to 270 in 1967, and to 288 in 1980.
