
Vital Stats Profile of the 17th West Bengal Legislative Assembly


The results of the elections to the 17th West Bengal Legislative Assembly were declared today. There are 294 assembly seats in the state. However, results have been declared for 292 seats, as elections to two seats have been postponed following the death of candidates. In this context, we analyse data on the profile of the incoming Members of Legislative Assembly (MLAs) and compare it with the previous Assembly.

AITC has the majority with 213 seats; BJP has 77 seats; Only two seats were won by others


